EMBLEM



Per bend sinister Azure and Sable, three lightning flashes issuant from fess point to dexter base, sinister base and sinister chief Or overall, a cross couped Gules fimbriated Argent charged with a Staff of Aesculapius of the last serpent Vert; all within a diminished bordure of the third. Attached above the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border. Attached below the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed" PAR EXCELLENCE" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red cross and the Staff of Aesculapius represent the medical profession. The blue and black fields of the disc signify the unit's 24-hour operation. The three lightning flashes allude to unit members' quickness in responding, providing aid and making sacrifices to complete the required mission. (Approved, 18 Apr 1997)
