927 Tactical Hospital emblem: On an ultramarine azure disc, bordered in or, a gules Cross bordered with argent is positioned at fess point and is The focus of the emblem. An or caduceus with entwined argent Serpents is surmounted n the cross. Argentd displayed wings Are positioned on both sides of the caduceus and extend to The outer edges of the cross. An argent scroll is attached to The bottom of the disc with the unit's designation lettered In sable. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and air force yellow are used in the design, Both are air force colors. Blue symbolizes the sky, The primary theater of air force operations. Yellow represents The excellence of air force personnel. The red Cross and gold caduceus are universal symbols of the medical profession. The cross also represents the mission of medical Personnel as provided for by the Geneva convention. The Serpents symbolize the two aspects of our medical mission: Hospital care and medical care. The white wings represent the Unit's

mobility mission, providing flight medicine support to Flight surgeons and aeromedical technicians. The white Shading of the serpents and wings represent the purity of our Mission, which is to save lifes. The white scroll with the Unit designation is standard f hospitals throughout he air Force. The white border around the cross is representative of The neutrality to provide medical care to all injured Persons. The emblem represents the unit's willingness to Protect the patient and the u.s.
