EMBLEM



Group will use the wing emblem with the group designation in the scroll.

Per bend Gules and Azure, a lightning bolt throughout bendwise Or overall a winged horse Argent detailed Gris; all within a diminished bordure Or. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "927TH MAINTENANCE GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine Blue and Air Force Yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The winged horse reflects the Wing's functions of air refueling and connotes the unit's capacity to extend itself to meet the needs of the job. The lightning bolt represents the energy of the Group's personnel who provide the strength of purpose to support any air refueling task under any conditions. The shield is divided red and blue denoting the courage and valor of those who perform their services to the Air Force and the nation.
