EMBLEM

Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The disc is divided into thirds, each representing a function of the Squadron. The screwdriver and sine wave suggest maintenance of communications equipment. The computer tape reel, antenna tower and field phone signify the communications operations performed by the unit. The quill, inkwell and book stand for the administrative and personnel functions of the Squadron. (Approved, 5 Dec 1989)
