EMBLEM







On a disc Azure, a cross couped Gules, surmounted by flight wings Argent (Silver Gray), and a Staff of Aesculapius Or, serpent Sable, eyed of the like, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "SALUBRIS BELLATOR" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "931 ST AEROSPACE MED FLT" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red cross represents humanitarian assistance. The wings of flight represent the unit's critical aerospace mission. The Staff of Aesculapius represents the medical profession and the professionalism of the unit personnel. (Approved, 14 May 2004)
