EMBLEM



931 Operations Support Flight emblem: On a light blue disc within a narrow Air Force yellow border a white flight symbol with flight trail superimposed on an Air Force blue globe tilted on axis outlined and grid lined in black. The globe with flight symbol is further superimposed on an Air Force yellow star supported by an Air Force yellow column. Below the disc, a white and Air Force yellow scroll bearing the unit designation in Air Force yellow letters matching the parent organization's emblem, the 931st Group. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is symbolic of the unit and its mission. The globe with superimposed flight symbol represents the worldwide mission of the unit. The non-descript white flight symbol represents Air Force operations with which the unit is charged to support. The swept flight symbol and swift flight track depict the rapid reaction capabilities of the unit and the unit's ability to accomplish any assigned mission. The Air Force yellow star represents the numerous functions the unit provides in support of Air Force operations. The star further represents the excellence with which the unit performs these multifaceted functions. The Air Force yellow column represents the unwavering, steadfast support provided by the unit. The light blue disc represents the sky, the theater in which the Air Force conducts its operations. (Approved, 27 Feb 2006)

931 Operations Support Squadron emblem: On a disc Celeste, issuing from base a pedestal Or, fimbriated and detailed Gold Brown ensigned with a mullet of the same, surmounted by a globe axis tilted to sinister and fimbriated and detailed Sable environed by a flight symbol contrail terminating to sinister side of globe Argent, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "931ST OPERATIONS SUPPORT SQ" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The blue globe symbolizes the worldwide mission of the unit. The white flight symbol with contrail from behind the globe represents the rapid reaction capabilities to the assigned mission. The yellow star and its base signifies the unwavering excellence of the unit to support and perform multi-faceted functions in its conduct of operations. (Approved, 30 Aug 2012)
