EMBLEM



On a disc per bend sinister Celeste and Sable, a lightning bolt bend sinisterwise Argent, fimbriated Azure, issuant from partition line a silhouette of an eagle's head of the second, eyed Gules, all within an orle of twelve mullets, seven in dexter of the second, and five in sinister of the first, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "MY WRENCH IS MY SWORD" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "932D AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle is our national symbol and represents strength, standing vigilant on rocky terrain. The eagle, facing the bearer's right, dictates how the Squadron supports the White House, Congressional Delegation, Air Force Reserve Command, and other U.S. Air Force Special Air Mission operations with a superior aircraft. The set of circular stars symbolizes the capabilities of the unit and the constant guiding light of the Squadron's focus on mission accomplishment. The lightning bolt portrays the group's unique mission to provide the best trained most capable and versatile worldwide maintenance and logistics support airlift missions for senior leaders and agencies critical to the security of the United States. The motto, "MY WRENCH IS MY SWORD," describes the personnel assigned as superior technicians who constantly display honor and pride in their profession. (Approved, 10 Aug 2017)
