EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, issuant from dexter a demi-globe Or, gridlined Sable, environed by three contrails terminating in deltas to dexter Argent, in chief an eagle in affronté Proper, head turned to dexter, grasping in its dexter talon a wrench and in its sinister talon a screwdriver of the fourth, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "932D MAINTENANCE SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle is the symbol of maintenance. With the wrench and screwdriver, it depicts the maintenance mission to ensure the readiness of operational aircraft. The three aircraft deltas with contrails represent the unit's past, present and future aircraft missions. The globe represents the unit's worldwide mission to maintain operational aircraft and provide trained personnel for the war fighting effort. (Approved 6 Jun 2013)
