Since activation, has flown missions to Germany, Japan, Greenland, Central America, and to other remote stations throughout the world, Its crews, on such missions do their own liaison and terminal work, establish an operating airline for the service and facility of the organization being supported and give maximum results with a minimum of men, aircraft and supplies employed.

During the progress of the greatest military experiment with new weapons in history, a daily flight from the United States to Kwajalein, focal point of Operations Crossroads were maintained. In addition, cross country flights in the United States were carried out to coordinate the operation and to transport personnel and material required in the experiment, rescue missions were carried out in the Pacific and many other tasks were performed.
