### EMBLEM



On a disc Azure, terrestrial globe Celeste land masses of the Americas Buff, gridlined of the first in dexter base a comet Or, thereon a red cross couped emitting a tail of the fourth, arcing and involving the globe helexwise to chief; all within a dimished bordure Sable. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "4TH ADOS" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "COVERS A WORLD OF HEALTH" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red cross is the traditional symbol for medical care. The globe represents worldwide deployment capabilities of the Squadron. (Approved, 28 Apr 1999)
