1100 Mission Support Squadron emblem

11 Force Support Squadron emblem: On a disc per bend Azure and Argent, upon a mound in base Vert, fimbriated Sable, a representation of the Air Force Memorial Gris environing Atlas of the fourth detailed of the second, supporting a terrestrial globe of the like, land masses of the third,

all within a narrow Yellow border. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "POISED PROUD READY" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "11TH FORCE SUPPORT SQUADRON" in Yellow letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The background of the disc denotes the 24/7 operations of the unit. The Air Force Memorial indicates pride in the units' Air Force heritage. The symbolism of Atlas holding up the world represents strength and the relentless pursuit of perfection in support of all Air Force personnel in times of peace and war. (Approved, 8 Apr 2011)
