EMBLEM

On a disc per bend sinister Or and Azure, a cross couped Gules, surmounted by the Rod of Aesculapius Sable, the serpent Argent (Silver Gray), eyed of the fourth, within three geese volant two and one Proper; all within a narrow bordure Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow

scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "LOCAL SUPPORT — WORLDWIDE IMPACT" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "11TH MEDICAL SUPPORT SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The cross and Rod of Aesculapius are representative of the Air Force Medical Service. The geese are symbolic of the Squadron's parent wing.
