Azure, in chief between two stylized lightning flashes chevronwise argent a missile palewise or emitting three vapor trails gules terminating above In base a deml-sphere dark blue gridlined and rimmed of the second and all within a diminished bordure of the third. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is symbolic of the Wing and its mission. Against a background of brilliant blue to represent the sky, the primary theater of operations, two bolts of lightning represent research and development. The three sections of each symbolize respectively, the sound barrier, the, thermal barrier, and the barrier of outer space. The missile represents a basic test vehicle with ICBM and space capabilities and indicates the Wing mission. Its three trails are symbols of guidance, control, and propulsion. The earth Indicates the movement of the test vehicle Into space. The emblem bears the Air Force colors, ultramarine blue and golden yellow, and the national colors, red, white, and blue.
