EMBLEM



On a disc Celeste, a cloud formation in sinister flank Azure, edged Argent, emitting from cloud base a lightning flash to dexter base Or, overall a bird of prey stooping, grasping the lightning flash, Sable detailed White, below a triad of mullets couched in dexter chief Yellow, all within a narrow border Black. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "12TH COMBAT TRAINING SQ" in Black letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The light blue sky with stars symbolizes the unit's day/night operations. The bird of prey emerging from the clouds, directing the lightning bolt, symbolizes the unit's all weather capability to direct and provide air power.
