EMBLEM

On a blue disc edged with a narrow yellow border, within two arced white wheat stalks conjoined in base, detailed gray, a white stylized castle garnished gray below a white helmet surmounting a yellow stylized sun Attached above the disc a blank white scroll edged yellow (for insertion of unit

designation). Attached below the disc a white scroll edged yellow, with the motto inscription in blue letter. **SIGNIFICANCE.** The emblem is symbolic of the squadron, and the Air Force colors--ultramarine blue and golden yellow--are used in the design. The color blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations, and yellow to the sun and excellence of personnel in assigned tasks. The unit provides three vital mission support needs and the three symbols are significant of food (wheat), clothing (helmet), and shelter (castle). (Approved, 12 Aug 1970)
