EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, between in base two polestars, one in dexter and one in sinister Argent, an eagle volant Proper, grasping in its talons an unfurled scroll of the last, detailed Sable, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "14TH STUDENT SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The emblem is symbolic of the unit's mission, which is to administer and supervise the academic and military training of student pilots in support of flying training. The stars represent the twin functions of academic and military training and the excellence required within. The eagle is symbolic of man's yearning to fly, while the stylized certificate of aeronautical rating represents the rewards of perseverance and determination in pursuit of that goal.

OPERATIONS

The flying training program converted to a five-squadron concept in lieu of the three-squadron concept. In addition to the 37th and 50th Flying Training Squadrons, the 42d, 43d, and 49th Flying Training Squadrons were activated. The 14th Student Squadron was inactivated. The 42d FTS served as the student squadron. 25 Jun 1990.
