EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a sword palewise garnished at the hilt with a stylized cross pummeled and guarded Gules, fimbriated Or, its blade Argent, entwined with a serpent Vert, winged of the third, surmounting in base a transparent globe gridlined of the last, all within a narrow border

Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "UT PROSIMUS" in Yellow letters Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "19 MEDICAL SUPPORT SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The sword hilted and pummeled with a Red Cross signifies the intricate medical healthcare partnership between healthcare support and members who are ready for worldwide deployment. The globe alludes to the support services rendered by the Squadron and the full spectrum of healthcare available. The winged snake symbolizes expeditionary medics and their ability to make medically ready members for worldwide deployment.
