Replacement functions for the Air Service were later handled by the 1107th Aero Squadron. That unit was activated at Flower Down Camp on July 27, 1918, moving to the camp near Codford St. Mary when it was opened in September 1918 and after the Armistice to Knotty Ash Camp in Liverpool. The purpose of this unit was to provide replacements to squadrons from the automatic replacement drafts arriving from the U.S. and to return soldiers who had been in hospitals and

schools to their units.
