EMBLEM

The sphere portrays the global aspect of the unit's mission. The mailed fist represents the hand of Air Force commands who exercise command and control of aerospace power. The eagle represents the unit's mobility, agility, and dedication, as well as the Air Force flying mission which is supported by the squadron. The lightning flashes symbolize all forms of aerospace communications which are used to "provide the reins of command." The North Star stresses navigation and flight control as distinct but integrated parts of command and control aerospace forces. The atom represents the electronic medium through which command and control are exercised.

OPERATIONS

On 1 May 1970, the 2866th GEEIA was redesignated the 1827th Electronics Installation (EIS) when AFCS merged with GEEIA. The 1827th EIS was briefly aligned under the 1923rd Communications Installation Group (CIG) from 1 April 1978 to 1 July 1980. Through June of 1981, the unit was oriented to performing its mission primarily in the central and southwestern CONUS, Central and South America. The 1827th EIS was redesignated to the 838th EIS on 17 January 1995.
