EMBLEM

Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The yellow and blue background also reflects around the clock support provided by the unit. The clinched fist, combined with the lightning bolts, indicates the tightness and strength of the security of communications support provided to the European theater of operations. The gauntlet and lightning bolts, combined with the winged sword (United States Air Forces in Europe) and the four-pointed star (NATO), signify the unit's relationship with the areas of support.
