Squadron members conducted pilot to forecaster evaluations, Notice to Airmen evaluations, radar evaluations and flight checks.

By the summer of 1965, navigational aid installations in Southeast Asia had expanded to the point that the two C-140A aircraft assigned to the 1867th Facility Checking Flight at Clark AB, Philippines, could not keep pace with flight check requirements. As a result, AFCS transferred the two C-140s assigned to the 1868th Facility Checking Flight, at Wiesbaden AB, Germany, to the Pacific.

On 1 Jun 1986, Headquarters, Terminal Instrument Procedures and Headquarters, European Central Altitude Reservation Facility merged with 1868th Facility Checking Squadron to form one unit. The merger tripled size of unit and gave three distinct missions to unit. Unit did not fly for 51 consecutive days due to maintenance problems. Maintenance on T-39 continued as a major problem.
