EMBLEM

The mountain represents Mt Rainer (one of the largest mountains in the lower 48 states) located in the northwestern state of Washington. The mailed fist represents the hand of the Air Force command who exercise command and control of aerospace power. The electronic flasher represents all forms of aerospace communications which are used "To Provide the Reins of Command." The scroll lettering "Communicators of the Northwest" represents the 1905th Communications Squadron being the AFCC unit located at the base of Mt Rainer.
