#### **EMBLEM**

Blue alludes to the sky, the Air Force's primary theater of operations. The "Old Man of the Mountain," symbol of New Hampshire, is indicative of the home of the 1916<sup>th</sup> Communications Squadron. The lightning bolts extending towards the aircraft encompass all forms of communications support. The star symbolizes air traffic control and aerial navigation support. The triangles signify aircraft. The larger triangles are tanker aircraft and the small ones are bomber aircraft. They are indicative of the daily support provided to both the emergency war order and overseas tanker task force missions of the 509<sup>th</sup> Bombardment Wing. The motto, "New England's Finest," refers to the superior caliber of the 1916<sup>th</sup> Communications Squadron's support throughout the New England area.
