EMBLEM

The emblem depicts the two functions of the squadron and the historical beginnings of the unit. In the sinister the familiar control tower signifies air traffic control operations with the North Star further stressing the aspects of navigation and flight control. The sky is ultramarine blue depicting the constant darkness found during the winter. The dexter depicts the northern portion of the globe with the polar ice cap in white. The flashes signify the electronic communications and radar surveillance which the squadron provides. The satellite and stars focus attention to the aerospace aspects of both the communications and the radar surveillance mission. At the bottom, the summer sky of pale blue with the sun at the midday point signifies the endless summer days of the Arctic; and the polar bear, the traditional symbol of Greenland, signifies the historical beginnings of the squadron.
