OPERATIONS

Ferried aircraft to the United Kingdom along the North Atlantic route, 1942–1943.

Inter-theater and strategic airlift to Europe, North Africa, and Canada, 1952–1965.

11 May 1964: A mercy mission was flown by a C-124 and crew of the 20th ATS; the emergency evacuation of a Danish boy, who had been mauled by Husky dogs, from a remote site in Greenland. The C-124 flew a helicopter to Kulusk where it was assembled and flown to the boy's home village. The boy was transported to the hospital by the helicopter.

Worldwide airlift, beginning 1965, including support of operations in Southeast Asia, 1965–1973; the evacuation of South Vietnam, Apr 1975; Grenada, Oct–Dec 1983; Panama, 18–27 Dec 1989; Southwest Asia, Aug 1990–Dec 1991.

20 Airlift Squadron launched their c-141 aircraft in support of cooperative nugget, a North Atlantic Treaty Organization sponsored exercise marking the first ever peacekeeping exercise on United States soil. 1995

20 Airlift Squadron participated in emergency evacuation mission to the Caribbean island of Antigua, anticipating the arrival of Hurricane Luis. 1995

C-141 aircraft from the squadron provided transportation in support of exercise Bright Star 95, a multi-national exercise that featured air, land, and sea troops from the United States, Egypt, England, France, and the United Arab Emirates. 1995
