22 Field Maintenance Squadron emblem. 22 Maintenance Squadron patch

Description. On a blue disc in front of a black pyramid outlined and delineated red between four yellow stars fesswise two on each side, a white screwdriver with yellow handle and a white wrench crossed diagonally all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc a blue scroll edged yellow and inscribed "CAN DO" in yellow letters. Attached below the disc a blank blue scroll edged yellow. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The blue background denotes the sky, the primary operating area of the Air Force. The wrench and screwdriver represent the tools of the trade of a maintenance organization. The pyramid symbolizes "support" which is the main job of the maintenance organization. The colors red and black are the squadron colors. The stars, two on each side of the design, denote 2 and 2, or 22, the unit and parent unit number designation. The motto on top reflects the "CAN DO" attitude of everyone in the 22d Maintenance Squadron. Emblem. (Approved, 28 Mar 1984)
