On a yellow disc, a blue cross bearing a yellow caduceus surrounded by a blue ring with four points, issuing from its outer edge at top, bottom, and each side; all within a narrow blue border. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater for Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The caduceus identifies the unit as a medical unit. The cross is an international symbol for medical aid. The globe indicates the worldwide mission of the unit. (Approved, 13 Sep 1988)
