Yellow represents the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel; and ultramarine blue represents the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. The eagle symbolizes manpower guidance, control, management and the advisory and engineering services provided to AFCC. The scroll portrays data gathering, analysis, and manpower information processing. The human figure symbolizes our human resources and the mission of the organization to insure efficient and effective use of manpower in support of AFCC.
