EMBLEM

Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow referes to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The emblem symbolizes the dual nature of the 2021st Communications Squadron as an Air Force Communications Command unit supporting the Tactcal Air Command mission. The radar dish represents all the elements of the Air Force Communications Command. The gauntlet gripping the Tactical Air Command sword emphasizes the supporting role of the unit. The lightning bolts signify the communications functions. The North Star recalls a time when craft had to navigate by Polaris without the benefit of modern communication and navigational devices.
