# **EMBLEM**

Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The lightning flashes symbolize communications/information. The radar tower, computer, and plane indicate the various methods of transmitting information. The globe reflects the worldwide scope of communications systems and the star symbolizes satellite communications. The Capitol refers to the location of the unit in the National Capitol Region.

The emblem was designed by A1C Jerry Isbell and depicts the US Capitol dome with

communications tower conveying the fact that the 2045 provides a considerable amount of communications service and support in and around the nation's capital. A lightning bolt spanning the globe and encompassing an aircraft signifies worldwide airborne and ground communication. The colors of the emblem are a dark blue sky, light blue globe, red and white tower, white aircraft and capitol dome and gold lightning bolt and border.
