EMBLEM

The emblem depicts the unit's role of providing communications and air traffic control services throughout Shemya Air Force Base, Alaska, and the Alaskan theater. The blue and yellow, the Air Force colors, refer also to the flag of Alaska. The island alludes to the unit's location near the top of the world. The electronic flashes relate to direct ties with the Air Force Communications Command. The flashes on the left of the control tower show the unit's direct support of the Alaskan Air Command. The remaining flashes depict the unit's support of worldwide communications. They are red to portray the squadrons' major command relationship with the Air Force Communications Command. The control tower symbolizes the extensive air traffic control services mission. The atomic symbol alludes to the unit's electronics maintenance function.
