EMBLEM

On a medium blue disc edged with a narrow yellow border, in sinister base blue globe with axis bendwise, gridlined white enveloped by a yellow vapor trail saltirewise in pale, one arced to dexter base and upward terminating below a black missile ascending bendwise in dexter flank, and one arced from behind the globe upward in sinister flank terminating below a black aircraft in the dexter top of the disc a white four-pointed star between three red and white arced electronic flashes, one arced from the top of the star to the nose of the aircraft, one arced from the bottom of the star to the missile and one arced from the sinister point of the star to the top of the globe.

The globe and electronic flashes represent the worldwide nature of the communications support provided by the unit. Polaris (the North Star) in the upper left portion of the emblem represents the air traffic control and navigational aids support provided by the unit. The airplane and missile shown encompassing the earth in their flight is representative of the global capability of the strategic forces for which the unit provides support.
