#### **EMBLEM**

Blue and gold are the Air Force colors. Blue represents the Air Force's theater of operation; gold symbolizes the high standards of the 2176th Communications Squadron; red represents the love

of freedom. The elements on the emblem symbolize the mission of the squadron. The radio dish, telephone, and air traffic control tower reflect the high-quality communications that the squadron provides to the 513th Tactical Airlift Wing, represented by the aircraft.
