AFCC boldly inactivated the 2199th Computer Services Squadron on 1 December 1983. The mission and assets of this unit, which supplied computer support to Headquarters AFCC, merged with the 1974th Communications Group, also located at Scott AFB, Illinois, to form the 1974th Teleprocessing Group. This was the first formal merger of data automation and communications at the unit level in the Air Force and was a precursor of things to come. The merger clearly demonstrated AFCC's ability to step forward and become the leader in information systems management.
