#### MISSION

The Warner Robins Air Logistics Center has command jurisdiction over the installation with the 2853 Air Base Group providing the housekeeping functions vital to operation of the installation. It requires 21,462 military and civilian personnel, with an annual payroll exceeding \$260 million, to accomplish the various missions assigned to units of the Robins Family.

Within the base confines of 7,625 acres there are 72 miles of paved roads, eight miles of unpaved roads, 13 miles of railroad, nine million square feet of space used as administrative and industrial areas, 1,396 family housing units, 100 trailer spaces, quarters for 1,672 single officers and airmen and a telephone system with more than 3,500 main lines.
