EMBLEM

A light azure and ultramarine azure disc is divided diagonally by an or lightning bolt. The bolt transverses the disc from dexter chief to sinister base. A vert globe highlighted with ultramarine azure longitude and latitude lines occupies all base points. An argent stylized aircraft, followed by a gules contrail, is launched from the globe. The aircraft encircles the globe from dexter base and travels upward to sinister chief. The disc is bordered with or. An ultramarine azure scroll is attached above and below the disc. The scrolls, which are blank, are bordered also with or. Significance: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The 30th Logistics Support Squadron bridges the gap between the arenas of the modern Air Force, the earth and space environment, represented by the globe and the two shades of blue. The squadron performs its mission by supporting the unique launch capabilities of the base. This is illustrated by the successful launch depicted in the design. (Approved, 20 Jul 1995)
