Combat in the Philippine Islands, 8 Dec 1941-1 May 1942

Departed from the port of San Francisco on the U.S.A.T. President Coolidge and arrived at Manila, PI, on 20 November 1941. Transferred to Del Carmen, Luzon, PI, arriving there on 1 December 1941.

Ground echelon fought as an infantry unit in Bataan, captured by the Japanese in April 1942 after fighting as infantry on Bataan. 18 Jan-8 Apr 1942.

Carried as an active unit but was not operational from the fall of the Philippines to 2 Apr 1946.
