### EMBLEM

On a disc Sable, a demi-flag of the U.S. floutant in bend sinister throughout Proper, displaying six mullets Argent and twelve stripes alternating Gules and Argent. Issuing from base overall, the head of an American bald eagle Proper, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "EAGLES" in Black letters.

Attached below the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "35TH STUDENT SQUADRON" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The six stars, one for each of the six distinctive competencies of the Air Force, on the flag represent space, the ultimate high ground. The American bald eagle, our national symbol, denotes purity and tenacity of the warrior spirit, while the eye of the eagle is the vision of leadership that is instilled in all unit members and students.
