EMBLEM



The 37th Medical Squadron emblem: Yellow: Sun/Illumination. Used to depict the rising of the sun; signifying the daylight portion of a 24-hour mission/capability. Additionally, the stars on the night portion of the emblem are yellow to show their illumination at night. Brown represents the Earth. Brown is utilized to show the mountainous topography of the region in which the 37th Medical Squadron is located; Tonopah Test Range. Light blue represents the sky: used to show the daylight portion of the unit's 24-hour mission/capability. Black represents night: used to show the night time portion of the unit's 24-hour mission/capability. Silver represents purity: used to color the staff portion of the caduceus; symbol of the medical profession.
