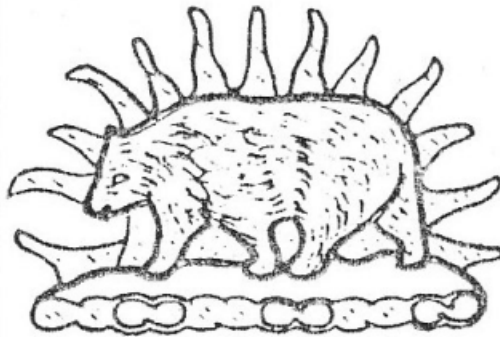

Constituted in the California National Guard in 1921, assigned to the 40th Division, and allotted to the state of California. Headquarters organized in April 1924 at Hollywood, CA. Relocated 16 June 1924 to Clover Field, Santa Monica, CA. Concurrently Federally recognized at Clover Field. Relocated in January 1925 to Griffith Field, Los Angeles, CA. Redesignated as Headquarters, 40th Division Aviation on 10 March 1928.
