

EMBLEM

The statue's torch of freedom that lights the way for the poor, beaten, oppressed, and downtrodden is featured in the center of the cross hairs and is ringed by four symbols that best represent the diverse services that the 48th Civil Engineer Squadron provides. The stack of coins represents the large sum of funds that Civil Engineers are responsible for. The compass symbolizes engineering design. The fireman's hat and ax symbolize fire protection. The house symbolizes the unit's significant facility maintenance and repair efforts and the Base Housing Office. (Approved, 8 Sep 1982)
