The 5th Space Operations Squadron inactivated 13 Jun 2000 at Onizuka AFS, CA. Other 50th Space Wing squadrons assumed most 5th Space Operations Squadron missions and the 21st Space Operations Squadron assimilated most of the inactivated squadron's people.
