### **EMBLEM**





5 Munitions Maintenance Squadron emblem: The emblem is symbolic of the Squadron. The background of blue represents the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations, and yellow the sun and excellence of personnel in assigned duties. The stars represent outer space and celestial bodies; an aircraft and missile reentry vehicle, while circling the globe, aim at outer space, indicating range capabilities and advanced strategic aerospace warfare vehicles. The lightning flash and trail signify speed and the olive branch is the universal symbol of peace. The atomic symbol indicates the atomic age. The five atoms and five stars also relate to the numerical designation of the unit. **SIGNIFICANCE:** On a medium blue disc edged black a yellow globe bearing an atomic symbol, the orbital rings black, atoms red, the globe between a black demi-sphere issuing from chief bearing five white stars fesswise three and two, and in base two green laurel branches saltirewise; in dexter flank a stylized white aircraft ascending trailing a red arched lighting flash and in sinister chief a white missile reentry vehicle ascending trailing a red arched flight trail. Attached below the emblem a blank white scroll edged black. (Approved, 31 May 1970)
