# **EMBLEM**



A disc divided yellow at the top, blue in base with a broad light blue horizontal band centered thereon; on the band a triangle with point to base bearing three equal stripes bendwise, green, light blue and red within a blue border. Centered on the triangle a yellow anemometer; around the disc a yellow border. Attached below the disc a green scroll edged yellow inscribed "Fighting Fifth" in yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is symbolic of the Squadron and the Air Force colors, golden yellow and ultramarine blue, are used. Ultramarine blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operation. and yellow the excellence of Air Force personnel in performing duties. The light blue area denotes the night operations of the Squadron. The triangle as a whole represents ancient alchemists' sign for fire, earth and air, and symbolizes the support provided by the Squadron. The anemometer symbolizes the field of meteorology. (Approved, 1 Nov 1967)
