## **OPERATIONS**

Constituted in the Regular Army on 8 May 1929 as Headquarters, 6th Pursuit Wing, and allotted to the Eighth Corps Area. Kelly Field, TX, designated as headquarters on organization, but the

unit was never organized at that location. Redesignated as Headquarters, 6th Transport Wing on 1 October 1933. Organized on 17 June 1935 with O.R. personnel as an RAI unit at Kelly Field, TX. Withdrawn from the Eighth Corps Area on 5 June 1936 and allotted to the Sixth Corps Area. Inactivated on 31 October 1936 at Kelly Field by relief of personnel. Redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, 6th Transport Wing on 1 September 1936. Chicago, IL, designated as headquarters on reorganization, but the unit was never organized at that location. Designated mobilization training station was the Air Corps Training Center, Kelly Field.
