## **EMBLEM**



6<sup>th</sup> Weather Squadron, first emblem: The insignia is representative of weather phenomena in the tropical regions. The six red stars spaced equidistant around the border of the disc depict the numerical designation of the squadron. (Approved, 14 Dec 1943)



6<sup>th</sup> Weather Squadron, second emblem: The American bald eagle symbolizes the strength, speed, and alertness of the United States and the 6th Weather Squadron (Mobile). The "tornado alley" and the atomic energy projects supported by the squadron are symbolized by the tornado funnel and atom nuclear symbol. The ground mobile device portrays an important item of equipment. Severe weather warning is symbolized by the cloud and lightning. (Approved, 20 Aug 1956)
