EMBLEM

On a disc per pale wavy Vert and Or, within a diminished bordure Azure, a wyvern volant Gules, detailed Sable, the wings superimposed over the border and grasping in sinister claw a moneybag Argent, inscribed with a dollar sign of the fifth, all above four crosses patee in fess of the like; all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "ANNUMERATIO SUPERUS" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "9TH COMPTROLLER SQUADRON" in Black letters. Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force Operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The wavy symbolizes the Rio Grande River dividing the old and new Air Force colors. The wyvern holding the moneybag indicated the primary role of the unit as the defender of the public treasury. The four crosses patee signify the four WWI offensives historically tied to the 9th Wing.
