## **EMBLEM**

On a light blue disc a black silhouette of an aircraft affronte above a yellow forklift detailed black carrying an ultramarine blue globe within a white net attached to a gold brown pallet; all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc an ultramarine blue scroll edged with a narrow yellow border inscribed READY TO MOVE THE WORLD in yellow letters. Attached below the disc an ultramarine blue scroll edged with a narrow yellow border. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The forklift and net indicate the mission of the Squadron. The globe reflects the worldwide mission. The aircraft represents the never-ending task of moving cargo in that it marks both the start and the completion of one step in the cargo processing cycle.
