MISSION

Trained combat aircrews in adversary threat tactics. The 57th ATG, an essential part of the 57th Wing and U.S. Air Force Warfare Center, is composed of more than 575 Airmen in nine active-duty, guard, and reserve squadrons.

The 57th ATG consists of two Aggressor squadrons -- 64th AGRS flying F-16s and 65th AGRS flying F-15s that replicate adversary threat tactics while training combat air forces aircrews. In addition, the 414th Combat Training Squadron (Red Flag), the 547th Intelligence Squadron and the 57th Operations Support Squadron also report to the group commander. Each squadron is focused on understanding and replicating specific portions of the entire spectrum of air, surface-to-air, space, and cyber threats facing our forces today and tomorrow.
