Over and through a medium blue disc, a caricatured, golden orange street car, winged of the last, in flight toward dexter, over a white cloud formation in base, driven by a caricatured pilot wearing brown flight suit and red aviator's helmet, at motorman's post, and having a caricatured paratrooper hanging out of the window on the side, and another caricatured paratrooper attired,

proper, standing on roof in midst of assorted boxes, freight, and bundles red, yellow, and green, and holding a brown gun in the left hand. (Approved, 15 Dec 1944)
